2-That the dimensions of each regular mining tract of four hundred acres be forty chains in front by one hundred chains in depth, and smaller tracts, except on lakes and rivers, in the same proportion.

tions, but at not less than one dollar per acre in any township, and at the same price as the other lands in the township, when it is more than one dollar per 7-That mining lands in surveyed townships be sold by the local agents for cash, but all lands in

GOLD AND SILVER. 9-That in selling the lands in the gold mining divisions, the department is to discriminate as far as practicable between purchasers for actual settlement, bong fide, and those for mining or speculative poses : selling to the former for the present prices and terms (subject to an increase to \$2 an acre, under the order of 8th August, 1864, when actually worked for gold); and to the latter for one dollar and Blue-laid.
