DEPARTMENT OF CROWN LANDS. OTTAWA, 13th March, 1866. REGULATIONS FOR THE SALE OF Mineral Lands, approved by His Excellency he Governor-General in Council. INFERIOR METALS.

1-That each regular mining tract in unsurveyed territory shall consist of blocks of two hundred or four hundred acres.

2-That the dimensions of each regular mining tract of four hundred acres be forty chains in front by one hundred chains in depth, and smaller tracts, except on lakes and rivers, in the same proportion.

The bearings of the outlines to be North and South, and East and West, astronomically. 3-That mining tracks bordering upon lakes and

rivers shall have their frontage upon such waters, and shall be subject in all cases to the public rights in navigable or floating waters; and that mining tracts so situated, shall have a mean depth of one hundred chains back from such river or lake, (exclusive of road allowance of one chain in width, which shall be reserved along the margin of such river or lake), in conformity with the above montioned bearings.

4-That mining tracts in surveyed territory shall be surveyed by a Provincial Land Surveyor, and connected with some known points in previous surveys (so that the tract may be laid down on the office maps of the territory), at the cost of the applicants, who shall be required to furnish the survey- masters, just opened, and offered for sale at most or's plan, field notes, and descriptions thereof, in ac-cordance with the foregoing regulations, and to the satisfaction of the department.

5-The price shall be one dollar per acre, payable into the Department of Crown Lands at the time of making application. 6-That in surveyed townships, lots presenting

indications of minerals, be sold on the above conditions, but at not less than one dollar per acre in any township, and at the same price as the other lands in the township, when it is more than one dollar per

7-That mining lands in surveyed townships be sold by the local agents for cash, but all lands in unsurveyed territory shall be sold by the depart-8-The above regulations do not apply to mines of

gold and silver. GOLD AND SILVER. 9-That in selling the lands in the gold mining divisions, the department is to discriminate as far,
