



CARTHER, (WHEREAS, in and Aug.-Gen. by the thirty-eight chapter of Consolidated Statutes of Canada, inti-tuled: "An Act respecting the preservation of the Public Health," it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever this Prevince or any part thereof, or place therein, appears to be threatened with any formidable epidemic, endemie or contagious disease the Governor may, by Proclamation, to be by him from time to time issued, by and with the ad vice and consent of the Executive Province declare the said Act to be in force in this Province, or in any part thereof, or place therein, mentioned in such Proclamation, and it shall there-

upon be in force accordingly; and the Governor may in like manner from time to time, as to all or any of the parts or places to which any such Proclamation: and, subject to such revocation and re-newal as aforesaid, every such Proclamation shall have effect for six months or for any shorter period in such Proclamation expressed; AND WHEREAS, although there exists no reason for serious alasm, the Province appears to be so far threatened with Asiatic Cholern, a disease within the meaning of the said Act, as to render it expedient that all necessary precautions should be taken for the protection of the Public Health, and it is therefore expedient to declare the said Act to be in force in the said Province.
