We have been travelling at the rate of 10 miles an hour, half miles an hour, and the train will not get into Brum till nine o'clock, if even then. The place is choked with carriages and engines; all is confusion and delay. I must close my letter and trust to fortune now, for nothing can be done but resign myself to its favors and knowns.
