



HIS EXCELLENCE WAS PLEASED

TO lay before the Council the Bill, introduced by

the undersigned, authorizing an Act of the

Legislature of Canada, passed in the session there-

of held in the Twenty-ninth and Thirtieth years of

Her Majesty's Reign, intituled:

An Act to provide towards defraying

expenses incurred for matters necessary to the ex-

ecution of the Registry Laws of Lower Canada.

Whereupon His Excellency was pleased to order

and it is enacted, etc., etc.

That, from and after the first day of Oc-

tober next, there shall be imposed, levied and

collected on each deed, instrument or conveyance,

any or all Registration Office in Lower Canada,

or on every document made in such Registry Office

on or after the said day, the following duties re-

spectively, that is to say:

(in every will, marriage contract or donation,

or on every deed or instrument effecting or eviden-

cing the sale, exchange, hypothecation or mortgage

of real estate, or on every conveyance or consideration ex-

changing title, etc., etc.)

On every other deed or instrument, Fifteen Cents.

On every search, with or without certificate, Five Cents.

That until further orders the above duties shall,

in all the Registration Counties or Registration Di-

visions of Lower Canada, be paid in money and

the amount of such duty, by every Register-

er, Receiver General, and Receiver of Taxes,

and to him, his heirs, executors, administrators,

and successors, that he may be accounted for

and paid over to the Receiver General immediately

after the close of every third month, to be reckoned

from the said first day of October next.
