On the first page—Robberies in the U.S.—The Salt Lake Tragedy.

The Hon. Mr. McGee left for Montreal yesterday, the Hon. Messrs. BELLEAU, BLAIR, and CAMPBELL having left the capital for their respective homes on the day previous. They are not expected to return here until after the holidays.

The Post of last evening, in speaking of the representation of the County of Carleton, mentions the name of Dr. Grant as one of the aspirants for the honour. We are authorised to state that Dr. Grant has not the slightest intention of offering himself as a candidate for the County of Carleton, nor was he aware of his name having been connected with the representations of that county until he saw it in the Post. There are as yet, in so far as we know, but the two candidates mentioned by us yesterday, and whenever else may offer the doctor will not be one of them.

There was something so brazenly impudent in Ms. Brown's rejoinder to Mr. McGee's second letter, that one might well question the utility of pursuing a controversy with a person so supremely indifferent to truth. Mr. McGee, however, displays a degree of patient consideration for Ms. Brown's point, which is truly exemplary; for, as our reader will perceive elsewhere, has indeed letter No. 3 to that gentleman, giving him a chance which it will be hard to evade of producing the mysterious "Englishman," who in his turn may bring up the "many other gentlemen" whom he promised to name to his capability as a faithful reporter. By the way, that "Englishman" must have but little of John Bull's courage in him, for every day his challenge was met in the "Globe," Nov. 30th, it was met by the "Montreal Gazette," but the "Englishman" and his backers still skulk behind the ample folds of Ms. Brown's skirts. Come out, gentlemen! Your appearance now will be an additional attraction to the amusements of the season. Mr. McGee has for the third time "publicly contradicted" your "state-meets," and your modesty should no longer prevent you from redeeming your pledged word. Ms. Brown, at all events, is bound to unveil an "Englishman" and convince the world that the suspicion of his being connected with the Globe staff is unjust.

A company has been formed in Montreal, the object of which is to dam the waters of the St. Lawrence at the Lachine Rapids, for the purpose of obtaining hydraulic power. The "Gazette" says the capital of the company is to be \$2,000,000, and that already large sums have been subscribed. The enterprise is a most stupendous one, and if carried out, no doubt it will be, will create the greatest available water privilege in the known world. The carrying out of this great undertaking, with the construction of one or both of the projected ship canals, would give Canada a commanding position as a manufacturing and commercial country; while all classes in a belief in the wisdom of law and make of Montreal, especially if the Ottawa Ship Canal were built, the greatest city on the American continent. The enterprise and public spirit of her citizens well deserve that they should achieve such a proud pre-eminence, the benefits of which would be felt in the remotest corners of our country. The "Gazette" alluding to the project says:

"How the entire waters of the river St. Lawrence (the outlet of the greatest body of fresh water in the world) and the greater part of the Ottawa river (which is the second thousand lakes of the immense northwest) combine, and in a distance of about a mile make a descent of about twenty-five feet, and furnish a hydraulic power estimated at four million horse power."
