WHEREAS IT HAS BEEN REPLIED to the Governor General in Council that much inconvenience has been, and is experienced by certain of the inhabitants of this Province residing in the vicinity of the Canadian Frontier, by reason of their being deprived of the privilege heretofore enjoyed by them of carrying their grain products ground at Mills (not on the American side of the frontier, and re-exporting the same under the name of *Cousins duty*, in cases where the latter quality of such Mills do not reside in such inhabitants, or their greater capacity made it expedient to resort to them);—
