French Corps Expelled. Paris, March 21.—The foreign policy of the Emperor, which has been under discussion for some time in the Corps Legislatif, has been endorsed by an overwhelming majority.

Arrival Out. QUEENSTOWN, March 21.—The Cunard freight steamship "Tropic," Capt. Longland, from New York, touched here early this morning.

Amalgamation of Railroads. MEMPHIS, March 20.—The Memphis and Little Rock railroad, has been consolidated with the El Paso and Pacific railroad.

A Just Sentence. NEW YORK, March 21.—The three men who outraged the woman at Williamsburg some months ago, have been sentenced to State prison for fifteen years.

Explosion of a Storehouse and Loss of Life. SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.—A terrible explosion occurred in the yard of Hong Kong for the storage of powder was blown up, and together with the British schooner "Thetis" was totally destroyed. Fifty or forty lives were lost.

Damage by the Flood in Tennessee. NEW YORK, March 21.—A Knoxville dispatch to the Times says: East Tennessee is damaged over two million dollars by the flood. The loss of stock is evidently very heavy. Over 100 carloads of corn were destroyed at Chattanooga. The depots were all submerged, and the freight trains were stopped.

The Fenian Meeting in New York. NEW YORK, March 21.—The Fenian rebellion in Ireland is conceded to have been a successful failure. The only party who received any attention are those who favor an invasion of Canada. Several meetings have been held on the subject of an early invasion of Canada, and the steps are being taken to carry it out.

Penal Concentration at St. Albans. The Herald's St. Albans correspondent says that several United States army officers, who had been confined at the village lately, although no longer confined, were removed from Fort Warren. The military officers who had been confined at the village had been consulting as to the amount of pay for their services. Latest from Mexico—Preparations for Greys have a special interest in the County of Montreal. Its construction would have the effect of bringing our front. CHERRYBERRY CULTURE. (From the American Agriculturist.) Mr. Gilbert Conant, of Ipswich, Mass., received a premium from the Essex Agricultural Society for his success with cherry culture. He gives the essential portions of his report, which is somewhat peculiar, as it describes a method of growing cherries without setting the plants. This can, of course, be beneficial only in localities where cherry-growers are not numerous, but it shows how a natural and unproductive soil can be converted into a cultivated cherry orchard.

THE OTTAWA AND FRENCH RIVER NAVIGATION. (From the Durham Co. Chronicle.) In 1845, Samuel Champlain, a Frenchman, descended the Ottawa River, a Frenchman, and under the name of Indians, who dwelt or roamed on its banks, as well as the highlands of the Ottawa and French River, he arrived at Lake Huron. This was the first time that Lake Huron had been visited by a white man, and prior to this time when the Hudson's Bay Company's men were on the Ottawa and French River, they were only in the winter months, and for the purpose of the fur trade.
