**The Board of Health.**

Under and by virtue of the Powers conferred upon them by various Acts of Parliament, retained in this City, and by virtue of the powers given to the Board of Health by the City of Ottawa, have deemed it advisable that immediate steps should be taken to clean the City.

**Now Know Ye that I,**

ROBERT LYON, Mayor of the City of Ottawa, do hereby order and direct that all Yards, Cellars, Stables, Outhouses and other Buildings, an Enclosure, Laundry, Kitchen, Cellar, and every other place or spot in the City of Ottawa, be cleaned up, and kept in a fit, decent, and hygienic condition, by the owners or persons occupying the same.

For the 20th day of April, 1867: And I hereby give notice that the Chief of Police and the Constabulary of this City are enjoined to proceed at once, to have the Police Officers, and other members of the force, and every person or person disobeying or neglecting to observe the same, on or before the 20th day of April, 1867, will be proceeded against to the law.
