Legislative Corruption The Spirit of the Times of this week gives an amusing account of a recent defeat of the no. torious corruptionists. The editor was one of the trustees of the "Lower California Company, and the secretary of the board. The company had obtained from the Mexican government a grant of forty-eight thousand acres in Lower California, and determined, if possible, to procure a charter from this State. But when he arrived at Albany he found the votacious fobby intoxicated on dreams of imaginary gold and silver. The first demand made by that modest body was five hundred and sixty shares of stock, at par \$20,000. At every intertiew they raised their price, notily sixty days after the introduction of the bill, it had reached the modest sum of \$500,000; They also wanted \$5,000 cash down. Unable to stand this impudence longer, the corporators applied to the New Mrsey Legislature for a charter, and after ten days a despatch was telegraphed to Albany to have the Lower California bill withdrawn. The consternation of the Radicals can better be imagined than described. The bill, however, finally passed both Houses, and the Lower California Company is doubly chartered.
