Among the notabilities on the boat this morning were the Hon. Mr. McGeck, who has commended the campaign for the Local representation of the County of Prescott, and Mr. THOMAS, of Plantagenet Springs, who is spoken of as a probable candidate for the House of Commons.

Arrived at L'Orignal, we met with Mr. Sheriff TREMPER, on the wharf, fresh and cheerful. A brief glance at the capital of Prescott indicates that it is a pleasant, substantial, somewhat old-fashioned country town, but the early return of the boat by the favor of which I send this, precludes my saying more on this head.

Turn we then to politics. The Council of the United Counties was in session when we arrived, and a number of gentlemen invited the Hon. T. D. McGeck to come up and address the meeting.

Responding to this invitation, Mr. McGeck proceeded to the Court House, and after a number of introductions, he, etc., and a temporary adjournment of the Council, Mr. McGeck spoke briefly to the following effect:

My friends, I am glad to see you here, and I shall say a few words on the cases that have brought me on this occasion to visit your County.

At the solicitation of several of you, I have consented to become a candidate for the representation of this County in the Local Parliament of Ontario. No far more than I was personally concerned, he would tell me frankly that it would be a source of personal inconvenience to himself to represent this County in the Local Parliament.

It was solely on public grounds that he had consented to accept a nomination for Prescott. It was important on public grounds that he should be returned to the Legislature of Ontario, and only on public grounds would he consent to contest the election.

He would not for a moment have entertained the idea of offering himself for Prescott unless the public men—both Conservatives and Reformers—had agreed that it was important that he should accept the nomination which had been offered to him.

It would seem to me that he had not been fairly dealt with, and that he had been taken in the cold, and it was felt that should such an idea get abroad among the local countrymen and old-regulars much respect might be done to the success of the new Constitution. He, himself, with his own hand had made the first draft of the resolution for the protection of the rights of the Lower Canada Protestant minority (cheers), and he wished now to go in his own person to protect the rights of the Catholic minority of Upper Canada. (Cheers.)

He appealed to the people of Prescott to enable him to do this, but if anyone raised the sectarian cry in his behalf, he gave them warning in time, that if five minutes after he would turn his back upon the constituency. (Cheers.)

He denied the sectarian cry, he trampled it under foot. All who knew him, knew that he had been from first to last determinedly opposed to it, and he would not—he said it honestly—accept the position of Governor of sectarianism. (Cheers.)
