We learn by special telegram that the Hon. JOHN SANDFIELD MACDONALD has been offered, and has accepted the Premiership of Ontario.

Such accounts as have yet reached us of the BROWN-DONAHUE Convention tend to show that it has proved an utter failure.

The Quebec Chronicle of the 21st says: "The formation of the Local Government has not been the easiest task that many have ever accomplished."

The announcement that the Hon. JOHN SANDFIELD MACDONALD has been offered, and has accepted the Premiership of Ontario, under the new Canadian Union, is one which we are sure will be hailed with satisfaction by the great body of the people of the Western Province, as a happy omen of the success which awaits the new Constitution, and an earnest of the determination of the Queen's Privy Council of Canada, so to direct the general affairs of the country as to harmonize the feelings of the inhabitants of each section.

From this consideration, we conclude that Mr. SANDFIELD MACDONALD's being sent for and tendered the Premiership of Ontario, has full evidence of having emanated from the Cabinet at Ottawa; and whatever of praise or blame attaches to the act, may therefore fairly be laid to the door of the Privy Council.

It is not difficult to divine the considerations which must have influenced the general Government in coming to such a determination, and chief among these may be confined to the desire to give due weight to the claims of the Reform party. Nothing could be stronger proof of this than the sending for the (politically) oldest Liberal in the country, to form the Local Cabinet in a Province where, by common consent, the Reform party is admitted to command a numerical majority.

The same consideration for the popular sentiment which placed three Reformers to two Conservatives in the Canadian Cabinet, as the representative men of Ontario, very properly suggested the selection of a Reformist as the head of the Local Government; and happily, since the religious element has been invoked to disturb the politics of the country, the calling of Mr. SANDFIELD MACDONALD, as the Premier of Ontario, cannot but be accepted as a practical proof of the Canadian Cabinet's desire to add due representation to the Roman Catholic body, not only in Parliament, but in the administration of the affairs of the country.

These considerations, conciliatory towards the sentiment of the people, we place first, because whenever a free Government is wisely administered it must be confessed that the first duty is to please the people—to command their confidence. Without this, popular government is a failure; but while the people are being pleased, the duty of the statesman is also to see that the country is wisely governed. And this brings us to other considerations which we are sure had their weight with the Governor General's advisers in selecting Mr. SANDFIELD MACDONALD for this important trust.
