GENTLEMEN: I have much pleasure in acknowledging the kind invitation given to me to become a candidate for the representation of the Metropolitan County in the Canadian House of Commons.

This offer of support from a large number of loyal and independent electors is no flattering one to induce me to place, without solicitation, my humble services at your disposal, and I consequently do not declare my intention to become a candidate for your suffrages at the approaching election.

The present is an eventful period in the history of our country. In a few days the Constitution will undergo a complete change; and in order that the good ship—Confederation—now about to be launched, may be safely piloted through the shoals and quicksands of political strife, competent and patriotic men will be required to guide its future course. As that measure revolutionizes the pre-existing system of Government, all good subjects ought to unite in trying to perfect its details, so that it may realize the results for which its projectors have labored so energetically; and whereby, through its instrumentality, a Nationally may be established on this Continent,—important in numbers, influence and material property—and as a certain means to perpetuate our connection with the British flag, which has always been the proud boast of a loyal and contented people.

I am free to admit that the responsibilities of a representative of the new Dominion, for this section of the country, cannot be overestimated. Although one possessing no mental ability might have been selected, still I will yield to none in anxiety and determination to fulfill the trust and responsibility which is conferred on me in an impartial, honest and conscientious manner.

My long residence, general acquaintance, business and property connection amongst you for the last thirty years, should be a guarantee that I will advocate every measure tending in any way to promote the general interests of the country, and of your important County in particular.

I have had in the past some considerable experience in Political and Municipal matters, and my aim has been to build up the Ottawa County by the advocacy of every measure calculated to develop its natural resources. In future a similar course will be followed by me, and it will be my constant endeavor to impress upon the consideration of the authorities of the new Dominion, the urgent necessity for constructing a Canal to connect (by the Ottawa route) the waters of the St. Lawrence and Lake Huron, as a link in the chain of that vast undertaking which must sooner or later prove an accomplished fact—the connection of the Atlantic with the Pacific.

I have always been, and still am, Conservative in principle, and will ever continue a firm supporter of that glorious Constitution by which all loyal subjects enjoy freedom of speech and action, with liberty of conscience.

It is difficult in the limits of a reply to a requisition to enter upon all matters that might require to be adverted to by a candidate seeking the suffrages of a free and enlightened people. I shall take an early opportunity of meeting you in your various townships, when I shall cheerfully explain more fully my views as to the various important topics now agitating the public mind of this country, and shall be most happy to hear the views of the electors, or answer any questions that may be asked by me. At my residence, corner of H. I. should be elected their representative.
