By-Law No. 253.

For the Prevention of Causes of Accident by Fire.

THE Corporation of the City of Ottawa, in Council assembled, hereby enacts and ordains as follows: 1. No person or persons shall hereafter pass, or use, or permit to be used, any chimney, pipe, or stove, or other contrivance, in any house or building within the limits of the city of Ottawa, which chimney, pipe, or stove, or other contrivance, shall be so constructed, or so used, as to be a cause of fire, or to be a source of danger to the public...

OSWEGO, N.Y., Dec. 7.—A terrible accident occurred on the Oswego & Rome Railroad last night. An extra freight train with empty cars ran into a tree, which had blown across the track near Painesville. The engine was thrown from the track and turned bottom up; five of the freight cars took fire, and were destroyed; the engineer, Jesse Trumbull, and the fireman, John Mather, were killed.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—In the House today the vote on the following resolution was taken—Resolved, that Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, be impeached for high crimes and misdemeanors; and resulted, yeas 67, nays 163. This disposes of the impeachment question.
