FINANCE REPORT.

The Finance Committee most respectfully beg to report to your honorable board, that they have the honor to lay before you the accounts of the Corporation of the City of Ottawa, showing the result of the board of the 25th of March last, and further that a balance remains in favor of the Corporation of \$1,125.19. Also, showing expenditure to 1st April, 1888, of \$4,274.78, which includes the amount of the Board of School Trustees of \$1,154.41. Deduct from this, not assessed for the Corporation of the City of Ottawa, \$5,000.00, which would leave a balance of \$2,175.19 in favor of the board uncollected, but in course of collection. Your Committee have seen information that no letters to purchase the six thousand dollars to bonds have yet been made. Your Committee recommend that such further steps be taken as the board may deem proper, to raise the necessary funds to complete operations to raise the Central School, West, with as little delay as possible.
