PROGRAMME OF THE FUNERAL.

(From the Montreal Gazette.) The funeral of the late Honorable Thomas D'Arcy McGe, will leave his late residence, 1074 St. Catherine street, on Monday, the 13th inst., at 9 a. m. The procession will pass by St. Catherine, St. Peter's Church, and thence to St. Patrick's Church. After the service there, the procession will reform, and pass by Beaver Hall Hill, Victoria Square and Great St. James street to the Parish Church, in the Place d'Armes, where a Libera will be sung. From the Parish Church the procession will go by St. Lambert's Hill to Craig street, and thence to the St. George's Church, in the Place St. George, where a Libera will be sung. Public bodies, national and other societies are requested to meet at the residence of the deceased, at 11 a. m. to-morrow, and to proceed by way of Dorchester and Mountain streets to the house of the deceased, and the Committee particularly request the members of such societies to keep together until the proper place in the procession is assigned to each society. It is also recommended that each society should adopt a badge of mourning to be worn by the members, and the Committee find it will be impossible to furnish mourning badges or crepes. This recommendation as to mourning will of course apply to the citizens generally. The Committee will feel obliged by each body or society, which intends to take part in the procession, sending one delegate to meet the Committee here at 11 a. m. to-morrow, Saturday. The clergy are requested to meet in the grounds of the English Cathedral at 8:45 a. m. The judges, the officers of justice, and the magistrates, are requested to meet opposite the Bank at 8:45 a. m.
