GENERAL IN COUNCIL, WHERBAS by the Stat section of the Act 31 Vic., Cap. 6, intituled: "An Act

respecting the Customs," it is enacted that-"Except in cases which by any regulation to be made by the Governor in Council, may be excepted from the operation of this section, all spirits (unless in bottle and imported from the United Kingdom, or in bond from a Bonded Warehouse in some British Possession) brought into Canada, in casks and packages of less size than to contain RAILWAY COMPANY one hundred gallons, shall be forfeited."

And whereas Brandies and other Spirits are usually exported from Europe in Casks or other packages, containing less than one hundred gallons, whereby such goods, when imported into OTTAWA & AYLMER, anada, would become liable to forfeiture as aforesaid, unless excepted from the operation of the Sist section of the Act referred to,-Therefore His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Customs, and under the authority given by the said Act, has been pleased to make the following " Regulation:"

" All importacions of spirits made direct to Canada from European Ports, shall be and they are hereby excepted from the operation of the 81st section of the Act 3; Vic., Cap. 6, intituled : " An Act respecting the Customs." WM. H. LEE,
