My Lords consider Mr. Whitworth's letter to the First Lord of the Treasury, dated 18th March, 1868. In this letter Mr. Whitworth offers to found WELLINGTON AND METCALFE thirty scholarships of the annual value of one hundred pounds each, to be applied for the further instruction of young men, natives of the United Kingdom, selected by open competition for their intelligence and proficiency in the theory and practice of mechanics and its cognate sciences, with view to the promotion of Engineering and Mechanical Industry in this country; and he expresses hopes that means may be found for bringing sci ence and industry into closer relation with each other than at present obtains here.


