OTTAWA MARKETS.

Timber—Ottawa, July 28, 1868.
The timber market is very active, many of whom have not yet finished their harvest, and others entering upon the wheat harvest, there was a better general supply in the market yesterday than for the last fortnight.

Potatoes, however, were scarce; there was a great lack of customers for them, and though very small and they were readily bought up at the rate of \$1.00 per bushel for new, and 90 cents for old.

Poultry—We noticed a middling supply of spring chickens which hold ready at our quotations. Last year's fowls have for sometime past been selling with very little variation at our quoted prices. Of ducks and geese there are none, and of turkeys not sufficient to be noticed.

Eggs are somewhat more plentiful, and sell for 17 cents.

Gate have taken a rise, and are quoted at 57 cents.

Hay—Of this commodity there is a good supply in, and it is quoted at \$12 to \$14 per ton.

Green Vegetables—There is a pretty good supply, comparatively moderate prices which sell readily.
