We have to record another good market on Saturday last. It was unusually large, and the usual commodities brought in were in great plenty. The supply of hay was full and has gone up a dollar.

Cattle were in pretty good supply. There were also tolerably well represented with a slight decline. Vegetables of all kinds were in abundance, amongst which potatoes may be noticed as remarkably plentiful and of good quality. A middling supply of peaches were selling at 40 cents per bushel.

Grains were a few tenths which brought 40 cents a bushel, and prairie at the same price. N. B.—Our prices for flour are always to be calculated in bankable funds.
