The same quantity of ordinary nitro glycerine would have produced a very violent explosion. Paper boxes exactly similar to the preceding, filled like them with dynamite, and armed with a copper cap containing a fulminating powder, were placed on an caken plank, one metre righty-two centimetres long, twenty-three centimetres wide, and five centimetres thick. When the cap was fired an abrupt and very victort report was heard, and the plank was shivered to atoms. Mr. Nobel then broke a cartridge of dynamite into two equal portions. He put one part into the palm of his hand and lighted the dynamite with a lucifer match; the
