From Rio Janeiro.
New York, November 20.—The steamer Jaramba brings Rio Janeiro advices of the 17th inst. The United States steamer Guerrier, 'Seneca, Kansas and Quilley were to leave Rio on the 17th or 23rd with Gen. McMahon for Paraguay.

From Paraguay.
Advices from Paraguay state the allies were besieging Lopez at Villista, that four iron-clads had passed the fortifications there, and that seven thousand Brazilian troops were marching along the west bank of the Paraguay river with the intention of crossing to Assunção, and thence, descending seven leagues to Villista, take Lopez by the rear. Lopez refuses to let any of the foreign gunboats pass up, but has sent invitations to the commanders to make a trip to his campment, where he assures them that they shall be well received.

From St. Domingo.
Later advices from St. Domingo state that General Onando was moving with his revolutionary forces on Aqua, and fighting is reported near that place. Baeza troops, under Cañero, had been united near Capotilla, and the insurgents in the North had proclaimed for Luperon. Baeza continues his infamous outrages on citizens.

From Paraguay.
