An important Bill before the Education Committee abolishes Grammar School Boards; places all schools in one section under one board; alters the designation of Grammar Schools to High Schools; provides for the establishment of such schools on condition that the board shall vote a sum of less than three hundred dollars a year for their maintenance of the funds; High and Common Schools to be distinct. None to be admissible to the High School until they pass an examination.
