have the best terms that can be got, but not by agitation for Repeal, not by nursing a spirit of disaffection, but by labouring earnestly and constitutionally for the public benefit. What, then, are "the better terms" which we reasonably hope to obtain? A larger subsidy? We say no, for in that case the other Provinces would naturally insist upon the same favour Our idea of better terms, would be a bounty to our fishermen, and if the Americans continue to refuse Reciprocity that our coal trade should receive some protection. We think also, that it would be only fair, that as the Union Act imposes upon the Dominion Goveinment the duty of paying the interest of our debt to \$8,000,000, that whenever our railways earn a larger sum than covers their working expenses, the surplus or an equivalent for it should be given to the Local

Immigration is a Dominion as well as a Provincial matter, by the Act, and it would be only just, in our opinion, that the General Parliament should, for a number of years, at any rate, vote a liberal sum annually for GENERAL AND SHLECT STOCK opening new roads, for colonization purposes, broughout Nova Scotia.
