DEATH-DEALING INVENTIONS.

A Tennessee mechanic has invented an instrument of warfare which, if it does half that is claimed for it, will prove more destructive than the needle-gun. It consists of a range of guns of 0.76 bore and about forty inches long, mounted on a carriage of very simple structure, to be hauled by one horse. The width of the carriage between the wheels is six feet. The gun barrels—twelve in number-are ranged apparently parallel, but divergent, so that at three hundred varies distant the twelve bullets sweep a line of about thirty feet.
