

ceeds the regular revenue from the Dominion for this period, not to speak of the deduction to be made for our surplus debt. For the total amount which Quebec receives at present from this source, is but \$958,000; consequently the revenue of the half year could have been only \$479,000, which was swelled by the Crown Lands revenue and other income to a real total of \$955,677. The entire expenditure for this period being, admittedly, \$611,058, the difference on our credit side is \$344,619, which, assuming the charge for our proportion of the surplus debt to reach \$115,000 for the above period, would be further reduced to \$229,619. There is good reason to doubt whether we shall receive as much revenue from the local sources, in future, as we have obtained during the first eighteen months of the Union. Besides, the treasurer seems to have taken, for the benefit of this half year, receipts which accrued within, and properly belong to the credit of previous periods; while it is just probable that a good deal of money appropriated for particular services during the last half of 1858, which does not appear as having been spent up to the 31st December, must yet be disbursed. Such outlay is authorized, and doubtless inevitable. In this way our apparent surplus may be still further diminished. We do not forget, in this connection, that the Government recently increased the taxes on the lumber trade to a considerable ex-

tent, and that the revenue, if it has not FROM ORIGINAL PRICES, already been greatly affected thereby, will be, to no trifling extent, before this day twelve months. We omit here any comment as to the fairness or prudence of this change. The local revenue is almost entirely made up of income under the head territorial, amounting during the six months to \$351,233 While there can be no great increase of income expected from our woods and forests, which are rapidly disappearing there is a tolerably good prospect of a much larger outlay than that of the past eighteen months, for colonization and other purposes. Considering the unfortunate tendency of such a governmental machinery and public service as ours, to cmers and the public generally that he has now a of our means and prospects, we are forced to the conviction that it would be folly to calculate upon any large surplus in favour of the Province of Quebec. Should it reach an average of \$250,000 per annum,

we shall be agreeably surprised."
