> ORDNANCE.—The joint committee on ordnance submitted a report on heavy guns to the United States Senate. The report condemns the Rodman system, which, while partially successful in smoothbores, is entirely unreliable in rifles of large calibre. Several of these guns have exploded spontaneously in the foundry while being finished, through excessive tension. The navy solid cast guns, the committee think, are better as smooth bores, but no better as rifles. Experiments are recommended to determine upon a reliable system of fabrication. The failure to secure better guns the committee think due to the influence of officers and inventors, who have secured the adoption of their own inventions without due regard to merit. The report contains considerable testimony, and a large amount of technical information of interest to iron-workers. It is accompanied by a bill which creates an ordnance commission, into whose haads it is proposed to place the duty of making experiments and adopting arms for both army and navy.


