CABLE NEWS.

GREAT BRITAIN. Encouragement to the Immigration of Paupers to America. London, March 4.—In the House of Commons this evening G. J. Goschen, President of the Board of Trade, addressed the removal of restrictions from emigration, and thought it advisable even to give facilities for it, and otherwise encouraging the emigration of paupers to America.

NEW YORK. New York, March 5.—The Herald's London special says the strong declarations of peace made by the King of Prussia in the North German Parliament gives great satisfaction here.

SPAIN. Madrid, March 5.—In reply to an inquiry of Senator Castellar in the Cortes yesterday, Senator Sagasta, Minister of Interior, said that the Government had prepared, and intended to issue a proclamation of amnesty for all political offences, but its promulgation was postponed on account of the recent conspiracies which had been discovered.

SOUTH AMERICA. Rio Janeiro, March 5.—Luis Rio Janeiro da Silva states that Lopez had an army and a fortified position in the interior. Carrer has resigned, and Carrer now commands the allied army.

HAVANA, March 5.—The insurgents in Omecies are increasing. The prospects are gloomy. Further grinding is suspended on account of bad weather. The cholera is abating at Santiago, but the insurgents are numerous there.

YESTERDAY'S DESPATCHES. Cabinet Appointments. Washington, D. C. March 5.—E. B. Washburn, Secretary of State; A. T. Stewart, Secretary of the Treasury; no one named for Secretary of War, Adolpho Botte, Secretary of Navy, J. D. Cox, Secretary of Interior; E. B. Hoar, Attorney-General; A. J. Creswell, Postmaster-General.

Grand Inauguration Hall. The inauguration hall to-night was almost turned into a reception. The crowd was so immense that dancing was almost impossible. The President and vice-President received the congratulations of his friends.

Both Sides of the Question. Nashville, March 5.—Grant's inauguration gives general satisfaction, though the suffrage clause is considered a blot.

New York, March 5.—The World says since from its ill becoming self-confidence General Grant's inaugural is a mere echo of the tritest common-places of the Republican newspapers. We challenge his admirers to point out a single line which he has contributed to the throats of them from whence he drew the material of his address.

Deaths of Bishop Sprague. Detroit, March 5.—Bishop Leffler died last evening, aged 65 years.

THIS MORNING'S DESPATCHES.

Gen. John M. Schofield Nominated as Secretary of War. Washington, March 5.—The Evening Post says that General John M. Schofield, of Ohio, has been nominated Secretary of War.

Further Nominations by President Grant. Besides the Cabinet, President Grant nominated W. T. Sherman, to be General; P. H. Sheridan, to be Lieutenant-General; J. M. Schofield, to be Major-General, and G. G. Anger, to be Brigadier-General. All of them were confirmed after a brief session.

President Grant has revoked the order of retiring Major-General Benjamin J. J. Price, Paymaster-General.

The work of renovating the White House has commenced.

Mr. William's Bill, in the Senate, to suspend the tenure-of-office clause of Grant's term of office in place of repealing it, is said to be the result of recent deliberations on the subject by Radical Republicans. As a compromise measure it is satisfactory to no party, but it is likely to be adopted.
