

REVOLT AT SING SING PRISON. Escape of Convicts -- The Keeper Strangled to Death-An Attempt to Blow up the Building.

The events at Sing Sing yesterday were of the most exciting character. The frequency with which persons have escaped from the prison is alarming, and now is chronicled two attempts in one day-one successful, and the second unsuccessful. It is the habit, early in the morning, before the rising of the sun, to take from the hall through the chapel down stairs into the mess room four or five of the prisoners to prepare the breakfast.
