I consider it as established, that " i is only the unclean or carnivorous animals that are dangerous to man, and the most dangerous among these is the pig. The plant-eating animals may be consid ered clean and not dangerous.

The main care of municipalities and individuals should be directed to the pigs, and their infection by triching guarded against. Re-originating of trichinge in pigs does not occur. They are procreated like men from father and mother. They multiply by legitimate progeny, and there being found in an animal pre-supposes infection from without, i. c. by means of food. In all cases of prevention it is pecessary to examine the food of the pige and to allow them no opportunity to de-


