

Emile Ollivier and his friends could penetrate the crowd, and it was past 10 when the candidate first attempted to speak. A happy allusion to the fable of Jupiter and the peasant enabled M. Ollivier to obtain a hearing. He related the services he had rendered the state, and expressed himself in favour of those liberties desired by the country. He ably defended his conduct in respecting the oath which he had taken to the Empire, and said courageously what he thought of the man capable of taking the oath with the intention of violating it. His ideas on political morality were very little relished by the ultra Democrats, who manifested their feelings by creating an uproar and interrupting the orator. When M. Ollivier at last alluded to the Empire as founded on universal suffrage, the storm became so violent that the Commissioner of Police declared the proceedings closed. Whilst M.
