LOCAL NEWS.

THE WEATHER.—The rain, which was expected and wanted for several days, came last night, but less copiously than the thirsty earth required.

COMMERCE SCHOOL VACATION.

We are glad to learn that the Board of Common School Trustees, at their meeting on Thursday evening, altered the time of the vacation from 1st August to the 1st of September, which was vacation time formerly. This year it is to be from the 10th of July to the 10th of August. This change we believe, is favoured by the promoters of the new bill, and it is doubtless a better provision for the school year. The old practice made the first term from the 1st of January to the 1st of August, seven months, and from the 1st of September to the 24th of December, five months. The new summer vacation embraces that portion of the season when the excessive heat of the weather makes it impossible for children to study to advantage, and when prolonged attention to study is productive of evil consequences to the pupil. This is doubtless a change for the better, and it would have been still better, had the vacation been a longer. Possibly the Board at its next meeting will give the propriety of this.
