"We have dined," he says, "at their tables, where the stomach is expected to receive with pleasure some thirty different objects of food, and perhaps ten different liquids. The French and other foreigners eat until they feel very uncomfortable, and require much medicine drugs, as may be see by the many chemists shops in the city. They have the same capacity as our pigs. Had you been here the other night and observe how these people rudely scramble for food at the supper table when we gave their feet, and seem to desire to hide the floor also, as each woman drags about with her long robe, on which it is not etiquette to place your shoe. Their eyes is painted round (not all of them), and they use coloring for the lips, and pearl powder for various exposed sections of the head, and artists work it into various designs; then the women put it on their heads with flowers; and yet they are not a dirty people. 


