referred to. Symphonized with Mr. Roger. Don't know of Mr. Roger giving any to the boy John McDougall. Was not present when the boy returned any pamphlet. Gave one to Mr. Roger.

Mary Donnelly was charged by Mary Horton with using insulting and abusive language to her. Fined \$3 and costs.

The position of the parties in the foregoing case was then reversed. Mary Donnelly charging Mary Horton with abusing her and threatening her and her children. Case dismissed.

Mr. James Coffey was the first witness called, and identified the letters published in the Times, on July 8, 12 and 13, and testified that the authorship was admitted by Mr. Roger, on July 25.

Mr. Patrick Higgins, barrister, was then examined, and said: "I practice law. Was acquainted with Mr. Roger. Mr. Roger handed me a copy of the pamphlet in the Division Court. Have not got it in my possession."

The next witness called was Mr. Chas. Mitchell, foreman of the Times. He said: "I superintend the news department and general business of the Times. The paper produced was issued in the Times office; certainly over one thousand copies were issued at that date."

Mr. Mitchell continued: "I believe the letter in the pamphlet agrees perfectly with that which appeared in the Times, with the exception, perhaps, of the address of the letter."

Mr. James Ingalls, sworn—He says he ever seen a pamphlet entitled "Our Queen," (authorship of Mr. Roger). [Mr. Gibb corrected himself and said "Our George."

Mr. Gibb never saw a copy of the pamphlet. James Ingalls, sworn—He has a copy of the pamphlet. Did not have any copy now in his possession. Don't know how it became in the hands of Mr. Roger. The title page was the same as the one now shown.

John McMillan, Daniel Brown, William Shields, and Robert Burns, were charged with breaking in the door of the house occupied by Kate Brown. Case remanded till this morning.

John Cook, drunk and disorderly. Adjudged. Joseph Doucet, charged with assaulting Phillip Gordon, was fined \$2 and costs.

Mr. Descaire was charged by Louise Lottour with threatening and abusing her last Monday morning. Case dismissed.

The adjourned case of John O'Shea, carrier, charged with obstructing the public streets, was also dismissed.

A charge was preferred against Kate Brown for keeping a house of ill-fame, and against a number of girls for being inmates of the same. Case adjourned till this morning.
