

It was as plain as reprint, and called by the compositors the best manuscript they had ever seen. The copy was given out to the compositors a few pages at a time, who set itu p and punctuated it as they had been in the habit of doing, each as he thought the sense required. The proofreader read the proofs, marked a few changes in punctuation, as he did in most of the proofs, and the matter was corrected. Another proof was taken and corrected, and when thirty or forty pages were ready they were sent to the author for his inspection. In a few days the proof came back, with the punctuation marked freely.
