A TUNNEL UNDER THE CHANNEL.-The London Builder points out the difficulty which has to be overcome before a tunnel can be cut under the English channel. It says :- Men, familiar with this description of work, look with a sort of amused surprise at the rose-coloured statements, which, from time to time, appear in the public journals, as to a 'Channel tunnel.' They do not say that such a work is impossible ; they do not even care to form a distinct opinion on that head; but they are very well contented with the applicability of the proverb Lejeu ne vant pas la chandelle. It is proposed, as caution is always desirable in engineering matters, that a drift-way should just be run under the channel, in the first instance, to prepare the way for the tunnel. The suggestion is at once economical, prudent and practical. Let us suppose a drift-way to be un, some 5ft, or 6ft, high and wide. Is it to be timbered, or arched, or lined with iron?
