FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE.

We have clipped the following communication from the London Times, which we think will be of great interest to those of our readers who may be engaged in farming and stock

Sin,-Having seen much written upon the subject of foot and mouth disease, and notwithstanding the expenditure of advice, scientific and otherwise, finding that the malady is steadily increasing and assuming s virulent form, I give you the system I pursued when my herd was attacked in the outbreak some years ago. I did not lose a single animal, or have the quantity or quality of the milk or beef deteriorated.

Uhloride of lime mixed with water to the consistency of cream must be applied to the swollen and ulcerated feet and joints twice daily till the disease is cured, the animal to be tied up during the application and the lime allowed to dry before it isset at liberty; vided with a strong paste of borax and honey, with which he must anoint his hand, and introducing it into the animal's mouth, smear effectually the tongue and throat as far as he can reac h; this operation to be performed morning and night, and, for convenience, at the same time that the feet and legs are dressed with the chloride of lime; these to be dressed first, and immediately afterwards the tongue and throat with the honey and borax ing at 7 o'clock. A dose of Epsom salts and 1 oz. of ground onger, dissolved in boiling water, and given cold once in the course of a week, will be advantageous in obstinate cases. 
