We give from the London Times of the 30th ult., the text of that part of Mr. Card-already appeared in our cable despatches, in which he referred to the Colonial policy of the Empire. His declaration is so explicit that there should be no further cavilling upon the subject. " Gentlemen, with regard to the army, you have an army of which you may well be proud. A French marshal has been quoted as having said that the English Infantry were the finest in the world, but, happil that is, for their opponents, there are few of them. If there are very few that leads to the conclusion that you are to have them maintained in the highest state of efficiency, both as to men and material. You are also entitled to have them, as much as may be concentrated in this country, and placed, in regard to reserved forces, in the most close combination, so that they may be so far welded and consolidated together as the nature of those different forces demands. We never had anything systematic, perhaps, in this country. All our forces are voluntary. It is our proud place that we almost alone enlist our regular army by a voluntary enlistment ; and we have in all our reserve forces proofs of voluntary enthusiasm which are equally honourable to the country, and a source of permanent strength and power, (Cheers.)
