WRACKS OF THE ENGLISH COAST. From the annual report of the British Board of Trade of the wrecks on the English coast, we observe that for the year 1868 they amounted to 2,131, which was 343 less than the previous year, and a little below the average for the previous five years.

WRACKS OF THE ENGLISH COAST. Of the casualties which occurred in 1868, 1,801 were British, 272 foreigners, and the remaining 58 were unknown.
