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AMERICAN NEWS. The Election in Tennessee. Nashville, Tenn., Oct. 21.—The Legislature balloted four times today for United States Senator. The latest ballot stood Johnson, 43; Hendricks, 37; and the vote was counted but four votes to elect him.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—President Grant specially ordered the seizure of the privateer 'Cuba' at Key West, Fla. He was the second son of William, the eighth Earl of Waldegrave; was born in 1817, and educated at Eton and Balliol College, Oxford, where he took a double first-class in 1839.

At the Dominion rifle match, at Toronto, the Montrealers won \$805, St. Catharines \$365, Toronto \$530, and Hamilton \$410. Quebec, outside of Montreal, only won \$205.

Twenty-two of the Departmental clerks of Quebec are implicated in the defalcation of the late Governor's office. The clerks were drawn on the calendar in advance of their salaries, and these drafts being duly accepted were discounted for mutual advantage.

Mr. William Davis, an old resident of the county of Lincoln, died at St. Catharines, Ont., on Oct. 18. He was a native of England, and resided for several years in Albany, but removed to St. Catharines nearly thirty years ago, where he carried on mercantile business until his death.

The total yield of gold from N.S. since its first discovery, 8 years ago, is stated to have been 100,000 ounces, valued at \$2,000,000. The total receipts of the Grand Trunk of Canada for the week ending the 11th of September amounted to \$2,071,000.

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At 5:30 this morning the city was visited by a severe shock of earthquake. At Beauport, Charlebourg, and the districts north of the city, the shocks were very severe, cracking walls of buildings and stampeding the inmates of houses.

The election of Mr. Canehon, as successor to Mr. Lemassier, as mayor, is not yet determined upon. The Evening News publishes a very serious article upon Lemassier's failure, and attributes the whole blame of the sudden suspension of payment on the firm of A. Joseph & Co.
