ARTHUR'S VISIT.
The following is extracted from a long editorial of the London Times regarding Canada and Canadian progress:

Any country might be proud of having given birth to such a daughter. The vicinity of the United States tends to obscure the progress of British North America. But the latter, though it grows at a slower rate than that neighbor, may possibly be in some respects more advanced as well as slower. At all events, her increase is marvellously fast as compared with the colonies of other nations.

While the political horizon is overcast with gloomy clouds, and the rumbling of a revolutionary earthquake is heard over Europe, a solemn and almost tragic interest is lent to the expected document by the conviction, after the lapse of 300 years, of an Ecumenical Council, a representative body of the oldest and most impressive form of established authority in the world.
