Whenever we see a new building erected, or when any new machinery is imported or manufactured here, the operations of which are calcu-We have latterly had the pleasure of noticing several instances of an enterprising spirit which we are happy to say is on the increase amongst us. The last of these is one of vita mportance, as it contributes one hundred barrels of flour a day to the city and neighbourhood. We allude to Mr. Henry McCormick's new flouring mill in Hull. It will be remembered that on the morning of the 17th June last, the old mill known as Wright's mill was destroyed by fire, including the machinery. The new building is erected on the same site. It is built in a substantial manner. of stone. Reckoning from where the wheels

are placed the mill is four storeys high, and of a suitable size for five run- of stones, four for flouring and one for provender. These are driven by Fleck's improved Tyler's water wheels, one of which is, besides driving a run of stones, also driving all the machinery the mill. Mr. McCormick has very wisely sought out and adopted the latest and most approved-machinery, and all other appliances required in the manufactory of flour, for this is a flouring, and not an ordinary grist mill.
