Cambria (Captain Craig), one of the Anchor Line of steamers trading between Glasgow and New York, and the outgoing s.s. Rose (Captain Galbraith), trading between Glasgow and Londonderry, which resulted in serious damage to the latter vessel, but fortunately without loss of life.
