But the weather has continued most unpropitious, and the grand spectacles of illuminations and fireworks have been unavoidably postponed. If they have to delay much longer they may serve the double purpose of feting the birth of the son of King Francis! The distribution of the thirty boats presented to be drawn by lot by the poorest fishermen of Santa Lucia did take place on the 30th, in presence of the Syndiac of Naples and other municipal authorities. The boats were launched to the sounds of music and loud cheering. At 1 o'clock the Syndiae addressed the men whom fortune had elected to favor, charging them to remain loyal to Italy, to liberty, and to the house of Savoy, to which they replied with loud vivas for "the princes." A boat-race then took place between two of the new possessors, the winner of which, beside himself with delight, precipitated himself headlong from the quay, and, coming to the surface with a beaming countenance, shouted to the umpires, "Evria e grazie!" to the intense delight of the assembled crowd.
