Ontario Bank, identified cheques on warrants issued in the cases of Westminster and Wilmut. He had received instructions to require endorsements from either Mr. Reiffenstein or Mr. Shay. Though the cheque was endorsed by Shay, he would not pay to any but Mr. Reiffenstein. He did not know to whom he had paid the amount of the Wilmut cheque. The Westminster cheque was not endorsed, save by the official stamp which he considered sufficient. Mr. Shay, clerk in the Receiver General's Department—The Brandon and Hamilton cheques, \$2,983.4, was signed, endorsed, and returned to Mr. Reiffenstein. He never drew any money on it. It was customary for witness to sign receipts, the cheque to issue to me, and after endorsement to return to Mr. Reiffenstein. This gentleman's testimony tended to substantiate the fact of a second payment having been made in the above named cases. The case was adjourned till Tuesday next. County Council. A communication from the County Council of Oxford, respecting duties sought to be imposed on certain commodities, and asking co-operation of this Council for a like purpose, was submitted and read by the Clerk. Also a communication from the County Treasurer, asking for further time to prepare the county accounts, &c., was submitted and read by the Clerk. Moved by Mr. Kidd, seconded by Mr. Cummings, that the communication and resolution from the County Council of the County of Oxford, just read, be received and placed on file.—Lost. Moved, in amendment, by Mr. Graham, seconded by Mr. Stewart, that this Council will co-operate with the County Council of the County of Oxford, as implied in their communication, and that the Warden be instructed to petition the Governor-in-Council, and both branches of the Legislature, respecting the importance of a protective duty on breadstuffs, pork, salt, &c.—Carried. Mr. Mohr called for the yeas and nays. Yeas—Messrs. Surtees, How, Dawson, Tomblay, Wallace, Mannion, Caldwell, Green, Graham, Stewart, Sykes, and Kidd—12. Nays—Messrs. Fraser, Mohr, and Cummings.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Fraser, seconded by Mr. Dawson, that the communication of L. Wilson, Esq., County Treasurer, be accepted, and that this Council acquiesce in the proposition therein contained.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Sykes, seconded by Mr. Stewart, that the petition of J. Wilson, Esq., late Master in Chancery here, respecting disbursements for firewood furnished to the office, be referred to the Committee on Finance.—Carried. The Council then formed itself into committee of the Whole, in accordance with motion. After a protracted discussion respecting the location and preliminary arrangements to be made for the erection of a suitable Court House, the Council returned to adjourn the committee sufficient time to prepare their report, to be submitted to-morrow, at 10 o'clock, a.m. Moved by Mr. Graham, seconded by Mr. Stewart, that the Clerk be, and he is hereby authorized, to advertise for tenders for necessary printing and advertising required by the Corporation for the current year, such tenders to be submitted to this Council at 10 o'clock, a.m., on Saturday next.—Carried. Motion of adjournment.
