

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatches noted in the margin, relating to the recent distubances in the Red River Settlement. Lord Granville moreover learns from the Law Officers of the Crown, that although it would be competent to Her Majesty's Government to complete the transfer by accepting the surrender of the Company and issuing the requisite Order in Council, ye. this acceptance would not place the Company in a position to obtain, by any legal process, the sum of £300,000 recently deposited by Mr. Rose for the purpose of being available for their payment; and considering that even after the surrender is completed. questions may possibly arise or further arrangements may have to be made between the Hudson's Bay Company and the Canadian Government, His Lordship believes that a short delay in the completion of the contract, however in itself inconvenient, may be more than compensated by ensuling that the surrender is finally effected with the full consent and agreement of both parties interested.
