The Office of Leaves.

In compliance with the request of the editor, I give a few hints on the importauce of the leaves to trees and plants, and of understanding their office in order to avoid falling into serious mistakes in culture. I can well remember when it was common to recommend the practice of removing leaves so as to let the sunlight on the ripening berries of the grape as well as on the fruits. It has not been many years since I have seen grape growers cut away at midsummer, and later, large portions of the growing shoots, destroying masses of foliage, "in order to all the strength going into the leaves might be diverted to the fruit."
