11. The occupier of the house and tenement in which a death shall take place, or if the occupier be the person who shall have died, then which the death took phase if such death shall not have taken place within a house, then any person present at the death, or having any knowleage of the circumstances attending the same, or the coroner who may have attended any inquest held on such person, shall, before the interment of the boay, or within ten days after, supply to the death toook place, according to his or her knowl. edge or bellef, all the particulass required to be egistered touching such death by the form pro-

vided by this Act. 22. If any householder, head of a family, clergyman, physician or other person or persons and deaths, refuses or wiltully neglects to do so within the time named, such persons shall, for each and every offence, forleit and pay a sum not less than one dollar, nor more than twenty dollars and costs, in the discretion of the preziding Justice before whom the case shall be heard; and it shall be the duty of the Division Registrar to prosecute all such persons so neglecting or refusing to make the required reports.
