As a matter of contract the forest lands could be cleared for about £3 an acre, and the ashes from the wood cut down, convert d into potash, must yield at least a barrel to the acre, and that would be worth from 45 to 46 (cheers). It might be asked what was the character of the land which was being thus given away to actilers. On this point he (Mr. White) would state one or two facts.
