Supernatural Fund.

Speech of Mr. Godin, delivered during the Debate in Committee of the Whole on the Government Resolutions relative to a Superannuation Fund for the Public Officers, on 16th April, 1870.

MR. CHAIRMAN—I approve of the principle of these resolutions in so far as they tend to compensate the public officers for the sacrifice they have made in the construction of a Superannuation Fund by means of compulsory contributions deducted from the salary of such officers. An act which has not a charge upon the public treasury, but which is based upon the contributions of those whom it is to benefit, cannot but meet with the approval of the House.
